BULK PICK UP

Bulk pick up will occur on the highlighted weeks. The following rules apply to bulk pick up:

| Limbs, branches and individual trimmings may be no longer than four feet in length. | No pieces of wood may be larger than eight (8) inches in diameter. |
| Grass trimmings, except of pampas variety, must be bagged for collection. | Leaves must be bagged for pick-up from April through August |
| The city will pick up cardboard and cardboard products but the cardboard MUST be bundled together and weighted down to insure that the cardboard does not get blown away by the wind. | The City does not pick up construction debris. Do-it-yourself homeowner projects and independent contractors are responsible for removal of any and all construction materials. |
| Major Appliances will be picked up by the City's Solid Waste crew but only after a work order for payment has been processed through City Hall for such removal. The fee for any appliance removal is \$32.00 per unit. | The City of Belmont WILL NOT pick up tires or chemically related products such as batteries, paint cans, thinners, plaster & drywall buckets and insecticides. |

The City of Belmont contracts with Waste Management for its residential recycling program. Anyone living in the city limits can receive a free recycling bin by contacting Waste Management at **704-824-2011**.

You do not need to sort your recyclable items. Simply put your recyclables in the green bin and place the bin at the curb with your garbage can. It will be collected on the same day as your garbage collection.

The following items can be placed in your bin to be recycled:

| newspapers (with inserts) | glass (clear, green, and brown color) |
| aluminum, bi-metal, ferrous and steel cans | HDPE (milk and detergent containers only) |
| PET-type plastic containers (soda bottles only) | flattened, bundled corrugated cardboard (less than 2' wide by 2' long by 1' deep) |
| Mixed paper products (e.g. mail, magazines, catalogs, etc.) | |
